
Assemble at the airport and take-off to **Kemi**, a town on Bothnian Bay in **Lapland, Finland** and also known as the official port of Santa Claus.

DAY 6

HONNINGSVAG ▶ NORTH CAPE ▶ ALTA

Breakfast, Dinner

Drive north and enter the northernmost point of Europe, imagine a place in the far north, where the Atlantic Ocean meets the Arctic Ocean and their frigid waters mix. This place is situated at **Nordkapp – the North Cape** – in Western Finnmark, Northern Norway. Here, the only dry land between you and the North Pole is the Svalbard archipelago. Visit the **North Cape Plateau** with its cliff face jutting into the sea, the plateau rises 307 metres above sea level. The **North Cape Hall**, holds various exhibitions throughout the year, and the chapel **St Johannes Kapell** is the world's northernmost ecumenical chapel. After which, Drive to **Alta**, a town on Norway's northern coast, at the head of Alta Fjord. Due to its location on the inner part of the Altafjorden (Fjord) and the fact that Norway's coast gets a taste of the Gulf Stream, Alta doesn't get bitterly cold. The low level of annual precipitation, provides optimal aurora conditions from September to April each year.

DAY 7

ALTA ▶ TROMSO

Breakfast

In the morning, take view the **Northern Lights Cathedral** – a huge modern church in

the center of town. Then, depart for **Tromsø**, a city in northern Norway. It is a major cultural hub above the Arctic Circle and it is renowned for its viewing point, which offers unhindered sights of the stunning Northern Lights. Begin with a sightseeing tour that will bring you to some of the best attractions in the city. The centre of Tromsø has a rich neo-classical architectural heritage, dotted with both beautiful as well as dilapidated buildings from later periods. We will take a **cable car** that runs from Solliveien in Tromsdalen up to the mountain ledge Storsteinen (421m above sea level) in the gondolas. From **the viewing platform at the upper station**, you can enjoy spectacular panoramic views of Tromsø and the surrounding islands, mountains and fjords.

DAY 8

TROMSO

Breakfast

Free at leisure on your own to explore Tromsø, where an array of activities are waiting for you to join. If you do not have enough of Northern Lights, you can join an optional thrilling Northern Lights chase and get a chance to witness Earth's most magnificent and colourful lights show with the expertise of a local guide, who will drive for up to 7 hours to unearth the best locations for you to watch the Northern Lights. Should the Northern Lights appear, a

professional photographer will also be present to assist you in capturing perfect pictures of the captivating phenomenon.

DAY 9

TROMSO ▶ HOME

Enjoy the rest of the day at leisure till it is time to transfer to the airport for your flight home.

Autumn

is a good season to see the **Northern Lights**



1 Avoid sub-zero temperatures

- Although the weather is still cold in Northern Scandinavia in autumn, it maintains comfortable and mild temperatures!
- This means that you can spend longer periods outdoors watching the Northern Lights without freezing.

2 Little to no cloud cover

- The months of September and October are believed to be the least cloudiest as well the warmest months.
- The lack of snow keeps skies clear and offers unhindered views of the Aurora Borealis.

3 Two for the price of one

- With lakes and rivers unfrozen in autumn, it's common to see two auroral displays at the same time - one in the sky and another reflected perfectly on the placid lakes and rivers below.

4 Increase in geomagnetic activity = higher Northern Lights activity

- With geomagnetic activity at an all-time high in autumn, you will have a better chance of seeing the Northern Lights as it makes frequent appearances throughout the season.
- Auroral activity reaches its peak after the equinox on 21 September, when the sky gets dark from 7pm onwards.

HOME ► REYKJAVIK

Meals on Board

Assemble at the airport and depart for **Reykjavik**, the capital of Iceland.

DAY 2

REYKJAVIK ► BLUE LAGOON ► HELLA

Meals on Board, Dinner

Before reaching the city, warm yourself up with an experience in the amazing **Blue Lagoon geothermal spa**, famous for its healing mineral-rich waters surrounded by jet-black basalt lava. Today, depart for the must visit place in Iceland, the **Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon**. The glacial lagoon is one of Iceland's greatest wonders of nature. Iceland's famous glacial lagoon filled with floating icebergs. Visiting the lagoon is breathtaking experience, you will have feeling like entering a magical world and you may even be lucky enough to see some seals. Due to the amount of spray the waterfall consistently produces, a single or double rainbow is normally visible on sunny days. Finally, a scenic drive with a view of Iceland's natural beauty and stop at the unique **Seljalandsfoss waterfall**, a narrow cascade plunging over a 60-metre high cliff. You may even venture on the footpath leading to the back of the waterfall for a different perspective and equally breath-taking pictures. Tonight, we will make our way back to the Reykjavik city and we will have an opportunity to venture out for an **Aurora Hunting** drive to seek out the famed Northern Lights.

EAT YOUR WAY THROUGH ICELAND!

From fermented shank to grilled langoustine, Iceland will surprise you with its eclectic dishes.



FISH AND CHIPS

Surrounded by the pristine and vast North Atlantic Sea teeming with marine life, it's no surprise that the diet of the locals mainly centers around fresh seafood. Combining local Icelandic ingredients with freshly caught fish, Icelanders take pride in their fish and chips, with some restaurants going as far as to using organic spelt in place of wheat and roasting the fish instead of frying before seasoning it with chopped parsley and Icelandic artisanal salt. Some of the fishes that Icelanders incorporate in their dishes are cod, haddock, ling, wolf fish, red fish, blue ling, tusk, plaice, pollock and more.

SKYR

Technically a soft cheese, skyr is made from pasteurized skimmed milk and a bacteria culture similar to yogurt. Unique to the country's dairy product, skyr tastes much like a thick strained yogurt with more protein and hardly any fat. What separates this beloved product from regular yogurt is the amount of milk used - the production of skyr requires up to four times the amount of milk than that of a regular yogurt. From dipping sauces to creme brulees, skyr is a versatile dairy product that complements many dishes!

LANGOUSTINE

Widely praised for its tender and mouth-watering flavour, grilled langoustine, a type of lobster, is thought to be Iceland's most delectable (and expensive) delicacy. These crustaceans are rare and hard enough to come by hence why they are one of the most expensive seafoods on the menu in Iceland. Like the proverb, less is more, Icelanders usually grill their langoustines with only three ingredients: butter, garlic and parsley.

VIKING DISHES

The toughest people on earth had to make do with whatever the land provided. With technology still a far cry from today's progressive advancements, fridges and freezers were replaced with the traditional way of preserving meat, such as meat and fish. Even today, Icelanders dry and incorporate their meat into their dish. Some of these include Harðfiskur - dried fish and Hákarl - fermented shark. Other Viking dishes that have made their way to modern Icelanders diet are whale meat, which is served either raw, roasted, as a steak or fillet.

Besides enjoying delicacies such as fermented shark and whale meat, Icelandic meat-heavy cuisine also includes lamb as a popular option that can be found on menus in many Icelandic restaurants.

As many of Iceland's livestock are free-range and grass-fed, hence the meat is generally tender and delicious and is served in many ways including lamb soup, braised lamb, grilled lamb and smoked lamb.



Top 5 Places to Visit in Iceland

From the popular Blue Lagoon to the Reynisfjara Beach, Iceland captivates travellers from all walks of life with its contrasting and distinctive charms.



BLUE LAGOON

1. Blue Lagoon

The Blue Lagoon is one of Iceland's most visited spots in the country. And it's no surprise why, this geothermal spa is renowned for its healing mineral rich waters and stunning scenery of the expansive and craggy mountains that encapsulate the area. Although not a natural phenomenon, this man-made spa and lagoon is filled with silica and sulfur which is great for combating several skin conditions.

2. Golden Circle

The Golden Circle is a notable sightseeing route that encompasses Iceland's most spectacular and natural attractions. From Iceland's first parliament to the impressive Gullfoss (Golden Falls) waterfall, the Golden Circle will take you on a journey that you won't soon forget.

The **Thingvellir National Park** is steeped in history and has played a crucial role in shaping Iceland's politics. Apart from its historical significance, the national park is also noted for its jaw-droppingly gorgeous geography, which boasts unhindered

views of rocky terrain and pristine lakes. The site's unique geological feature and natural amphitheatre-ish design makes it great for public speaking and holding meetings.

The **Gullfoss Waterfall** or the Golden Falls is undoubtedly one of Iceland's best attractions. Consisting of three drops, the fall's last plunge takes the glacial waters south through a deep and narrow gorge. The natural attraction derived its name from the golden hue it emanates when the Sun's rays hits the sediments in the glacial waters.

The **Strokkur Geyser** is another favourite stop in the Golden Circle route. The highly active geyser shoots water 30 metres into the air every few minutes. Situated in Haukadalur, a valley in Iceland, the area is steeped in more than a 1000 years of history and is home to more than a dozen hot water blow holes.

3. South Coast


Apart from the bustling capital and the scenic Golden Circle, the South Coast of Iceland is home additional wonders such as the Reynisfjara Beach, Seljalandsfoss waterfall and the Skogafoss waterfall.

The **Reynisfjara Beach** in Vik strays from the conventional white, sandy beach fringed with palm trees. In fact, it's the outstanding features of this particular spot that makes it a noteworthy sight. Apart from the unmistakable black sand that stretches as far as the eye can see, the beach is also noted for its almost symmetrical, hexagonal shaped basalt columns that cover an extensive portion of the cliff-walls surrounding the beach.



Situated in the South Island of Iceland, The Seljalandsfoss and the Skogafoss are well-known for their picturesque plunges. The 65-meter **Seljalandsfoss** has a path that will lead you to the back of the waterfall. Standing behind the gushing curtain of water, you'll have a unique and unforgettable vantage point that offers an amazing view of the sprawling green meadow.

Located 30 km from the Seljalandsfoss, the 60-meter **Skogafoss** is as equally stunning as the Seljalandsfoss. The which is situated on the Skoga River, is fed by two glaciers, the Eyjafjallajökull and Myrdalsjökull. Most travellers visiting this waterfall usually make the climb up the top of the waterfall to catch a glimpse of Iceland's incredible coastline.



4. Jokulsarlon

Needing little to no introduction, the **Jokulsarlon** is a glacial lagoon bordering the Vatnajökull National Park. The site is noted for its crystal-glass looking ice blocks that come in a myriad of colours, including blue, white, turquoise and black. Besides watching these 1000-year-old chunks of glacial ice float out to the sea, the lagoon is also a popular place to see the Northern Lights. Its enormous size and almost enigmatic ambience has served as the backdrop of famous movies and tv shows like, "Batman Begins" and "Game of Thrones".

5. Langjökull Glacier Ice Cave

Delve into an exciting adventure of Iceland's second largest glacier as you embark on an extraordinary ride in specially modified monster glacier trucks that will bring you across the top of the ice cap with stunning views. An experienced guide will lead the way to the icy blue heart of the glacier as he explains the history and basic knowledge about the natural ice layers on the glacier walls. Complete with narrow ice tunnels, eerily beautiful crevasses and a built-in chapel, Langjökull offers a surreal experience that you will never forget.



Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Today, we will arrive in **Murmansk**, the gateway to the **Russian Arctic** where few visitors venture. Visit the "Saami City". We will have a chance to take a short ride in a **sleigh drawn by reindeers** and then warm ourselves up with a traditional soup. After which, we will make our way to Kirovsk, a small town located at an altitude of 350 meters, at the very foot of the Khibiny Mountains. At the entrance of the village we can see the Orthodox Church of the Image of Edessa, with its colourful red bricks and golden domes. Tonight, we will have a night trip for **Northern Lights hunting**. The Khibiny Mountains are the perfect place to observe the Northern Lights. We will leave the village by coach before walking through a wide track to reach a valley hidden between the mountains.

DAY 6 KIROVSK ▶ MURMANSK

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Our day begins in the **Khibiny Mountains**, which is comprised of spectacular terrains and beautiful valleys. The mountains also create a unique setting for snowmobile safaris. We will leave the village through a valley and head towards the heart of the range to reach a mountain pass. After

which, we visit the "**Snow Village**" in **Kirovsk**, the largest snow-carved structure in the world, which consists of more than 20 chambers and numerous connecting corridors. We will then **descent in "vatrushki"** (inflatable sled), where you will have an opportunity to practice a pastime that all Russians have loved since their childhood: to go down a small slope riding "vatrushki" ("donuts"), a kind of a round-shaped inflatable sledge that glides at full speed on snow and ice. Stop at **Lake Imandra** and visit the farm of the famous Russian "huskies", that are specially trained to perform in the harsh polar conditions. We can **enjoy a short ride in a husky-drawn sledge** on the frozen waters of Lake Imandra and then warm up with some **Russian vodka, which will be accompanied by the typical "zakusky"**. Tonight, we will make our way back to Murmansk and on the way, we will **hunt for the Northern Lights**.

Snow Village

As one of Russia's most visited amusement parks, the Snow Village in Kirovsk charms visitors with its intricate sculptors and finely chiseled interiors made out of snow. Walk down the snowy tunnels snaking through the entirety of the village in a maze-like fashion and admire the carvings of everything from animals to people on the walls. Every year, the vaults in the Snow Village are adorned with a plethora of snow and ice sculptors from all over the region. Visitors can also partake in several activities, including riding a snow banana—a banana boat sled pulled by a snowmobile.



Inflatable Tube Sledging

Vatrushka or Inflatable Tube Sledging is a popular winter activity in Russia. Tube Sledging is just like normal sledging in many ways, but instead of going down a slope on a flat vehicle/sledge, Tube Sledging utilizes a doughnut or a bagel shaped inflatable sledge. The family-friendly activity can be enjoyed by almost anyone as the tubes are available in different sizes for children and adults.

Snowmobile Safari

Get your adrenaline pumping as you traverse the snow-clad lands on your very own snowmobile. Explore the dramatic landscapes and pass the towering Khibiny Mountains. The exhilarating experience of exploring the region on a high-powered motorized vehicle is something everyone needs to do at least once in their lifetime. Learn more about the region as an experienced guide leads you through a designated route.

Reindeer sledding

Let these powerful yet docile creatures pull you across the snow-covered lands. Immerse yourself in the quiet arctic wilderness of Russia, as the only sounds that will accompany you out here are the padded footfalls of the reindeer harnessed to your sleigh and sound of the wind whooshing past you as you are pulled through the vast, forested region.

Troika sleighing

Developed in the 17th and 18th century, the unique Troika is a traditional Russian sleigh. Derived from the word triplet or trio, Troika usually consists of three horses harnessed to a sleigh. Before it became a popular pastime among visitors and locals, the activity was a primarily used for transporting mail and passengers over long distances. Although Troika sleighing is a distinctively Russian activity, the mode of transport quickly spread to other parts of Eastern Europe over the years.



Murmansk

Situated in northwest Russia, above the Arctic Circle, Murmansk covers an extensive area of 20 km along the craggy Kola Bay. The city sits on the banks from the North to the South of the Murmansk Fjord, captivating travellers with breath-taking vistas. Besides being the largest city in the Arctic Circle, Murmansk is also noted for being the starting point for travellers venturing into the Russian Arctic and the Russian Lapland. The city is renowned for being one of the largest ice-free ports in Russia and is filled with intriguing attractions and activities, from the Nuclear Icebreaker "Lenin" to the culturally-rich Saami City.

Saami City

Visit the Saami City, situated 110 km south of Murmansk and immerse yourself in the unique culture of the Saami people. The settlement offers visitors a peek into the lives of these skilled, indigenous group of people. Most of the residents of this settlement still practice a traditional way of life - their primary occupation consists of reindeer farming, fishing and hunting. Their extensive knowledge of the Russian tundra, rich and distinctive folklore, and even their vibrant, traditional Lappish clothing are some of the things that the Saami people are known for. Get to know these extremely hospitable and friendly people as they introduce their culture, tell stories and share their traditions with you.

Northern Lights hunting trip

Another must-do activity is embarking on a Northern Lights hunting trip. The visibility of this natural phenomenon is largely dependent on light pollution emitted by urban settlements. However, Murmansk has an advantage over other cities in the country. It's considered to be one of the best places to catch a glimpse of the Northern Lights due to its location — 300 km above the Polar Circle or in the "Oval of the Northern Lights". Additionally its almost consistent weather, which sees more clear days than most cities with similar latitudes, provide it with a higher chance of visibility of the Aurora Borealis.

Nuclear Icebreaker "Lenin"

With nearly 600,000 nautical miles under her belt, the Nuclear Icebreaker "Lenin", unlike conventional vessels, is a traditional diesel-powered icebreaker which is currently located near the Atomflot, a Russian company that maintains the world's only fleet of nuclear-powered icebreakers. Onboard the Lenin, visitors can see various parts of the ship, including the crew cabins, captain's bridge and the cinema.



As hues of green, pink and violet lights dance across the Arctic sky, one can't help but think of the northern lights as some sort of performance orchestrated by Mother Nature. For ages, these brilliant lights have mesmerised billions, and most, if not all, have described them as a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

The best place to immerse yourself in the magic of the northern lights is at the famed Aurora Sky Station, which is located right on the summit of Mount Nuolja in Sweden's Abisko National Park. Also known as Abisko Sky Station, this site is said to be one of the best places in the world to see the northern lights in its full splendour.

The chairlift ride up to the summit is an experience in itself; the quiet night accompanied with views of the star-studded night is an amazing sight to behold. You will first be greeted by a large viewing deck overlooking the Abisko National Park, and if you can't stand the chilly weather, head indoors where you will find a cosy café, souvenir shop, look-out tower and an exhibition on the northern lights. These facilities are all designed with minimal lighting to enhance your viewing of the night sky.

Although there is no guarantee that you will see the northern lights during your visit, your odds do increase the longer you stay to catch the spectacular lights. But believe us, the wait is definitely worth it.

often come close to the boat as they are very curious, so be prepared for big splashes. The experience here in the North Norwegian waters is completely different from the rest of the world because the whales come here to feed and hunt, and they are extremely active. Remember to bring your camera and take shots of not just the whales, but also other wildlife like seals or sea eagles.

DAY 5

TROMSO ▶ LONGYEARBYEN

Breakfast, Dinner

Board a domestic flight to **Longyearbyen**, the administrative centre of **Svalbard Island**, as well as the Northernmost settlement with a population of around 2000. The destination is also the realm of the polar bear. Meet up with a local city guide to get an overview of Longyearbyen and the surrounding areas. You will be guided through the major local sights and history of the administrative centre. The tour will bring you close to the coal mines, some research areas, village, church, and the global seed vault which is the world's largest seed storage. There will be stops along the way to take photographs. Visit **Svalbard Museum** - entrance included, which will feature an exhibition on Svalbard's history and present natural places in Arctic Norway.

DAY 6

LONGYEARBYEN

Breakfast, Dinner

Embark on a Husky Sledge Safari. This activity will give you an introduction to dog sledding. The guide will welcome you and provide you with information about the trip. You will also be provided with the necessary clothing for the activities. At **Trapper's**

Station, 90 happy Alaskan Huskies will be waiting for you to take you for a ride. You will harness your own dog teams and will share your sled with one other person. After the activity enjoy hot drinks and some biscuits in the **Trapper's cabin**. For this activity, visitors need not have any previous experience with dog sledding. We will embark on an Aurora Chasing adventure via snowmobile where you will join a snowmobile tour. We will hunt for the **Northern Lights** and afterwards visit the **Northern Light Camp**. Drive through **Adventalen**, which extends eastward from Longyearbyen and into a river landscape that will take you to **Tellbreen**. The trip will then take you to glacier where you will have a closer look at the ice structures. The rock and ice formed by melting water provides is an impressive view. After walking on the glacier, get relax in a tent or warm yourself up near the bonfire. While being seated at the table, on benches covered by reindeer hides, you will be served a hot lunch while the guide recounts fascinating stories from **Svalbard**. After a warm and sumptuous lunch, we will get back on our snowmobiles and head back to **Longyearbyen**. On the way back, we will stop at a pingo in Adventdalen. This typical polar phenomenon presents itself as a rounded knoll with an ice core. Pingos are formed when pressurised glacial water penetrates holes or cracks in the permafrost.

Note: Minimum age for the Aurora Chasing by Snowmobile tour and the Husky Sledge Safari tour is 6 years old. The route and duration of Snowmobile and Husky are subject to change by weather condition. Driver is required to show valid driving license.

You and your traveling companions are deemed to have read, understood and accepted the following Terms and Conditions. EU Holidays Pte Ltd shall be referred to as "the Company" in the following:

1. RESERVATION, DEPOSIT & FULL PAYMENT

1.1 If your minimum deposit is less than the required amount, kindly top up the difference within the next two (2) days.

- 1.2 Payment of deposit does not constitute confirmation of the tour. All group tours are subject to a minimum group size (as determined by the Company) in order for the confirmation to be effected and for the departure to be finalised.
- 1.3 Full payment is required no later than twenty one (21) days prior to departure. In case of tours in peak season, full payment must be made one month before departure. If full payment is not received by the stipulated deadline, the Company reserves the right to forfeit the deposit and cancel the reservation. In such an event, the cancellation fee as stated in Section 2 is payable by the Customer.
- 1.4 By making deposit and balance payment, it is deemed that you have read, understood and accepted the Tour Booking Terms and Conditions in the booking form.
- 1.5 The Company reserves the right to request for a top-up on initial deposit for immediate issuance of air tickets, to avoid incurring additional surcharges.
- 1.6 Customers must top-up the deposits for ticket issuance as and when the air-tickets are required to be issued by the airlines at the stipulated deadline without prior notice. Failure to do so, the Company has the right to cancel the tour and the deposit will be forfeited.
- 1.7 Any amendment within **fourteen (14) days** or after tickets issued, amendment fee would be the same as cancellation fee stipulated in the Terms and Conditions.

2. CANCELLATION BY THE CUSTOMER

- 2.1 Cancellation of booking must be made in writing or in person to avoid any misunderstanding.
- 2.2 The following cancellation fees apply once any group tour package booking is made:

- 2.3 The above cancellation fees apply if the air-tickets are not issued. If the air-tickets are issued, the value of the air-tickets will be added onto the cancellation fees. Company reserves the right to issue air ticket without prior notice. If the deposit amount is insufficient to cover the cancellation fee, the Customers must pay for the difference.
- 2.4 'Working days' refers to Monday to Friday excluding public holidays.
- 2.5 For Free and Easy packages, administrative fees and / or one (1) night hotel rate will be imposed for those travel documents not issued. Once

issuance of travel documents, changes will not be allowed and has no refund value.

3. CANCELLATION BY THE COMPANY

- 3.1 The Company acts as an agent for service suppliers. After deposit or full payment has been made, all arrangements are still subject to final confirmation by service suppliers. At times due to low subscription for a group tour, the Company may choose to cancel the entire tour fourteen (14) days prior to departure.
- 3.2 The Company shall also not be held liable for any contingent costs incurred by the Customer arising from the cancellation.
- 3.3 The Company may recommend alternative tours either to the same destination or other tours, based on the current tour fare of that cancellation period. All prior special discounts given will be not extended for the alternative tours. Should the Customer decide not to accept the alternatives, a full refund on the amount paid by the Customer will be made accordingly by the Company without further obligation or liabilities on the part of the Company and that the Customers shall be deemed to have agreed to release the Company from all liabilities or damages in connection with the cancellation. There shall be no claim for inconvenience, loss of leave and transportation cost due to the cancellation of tour.

4. REFUND POLICY

- 4.1 No refund will be made with respect to accommodation, meals, sightseeing tours or any other services included in the tour fare but not utilised by the Customer, either in part or full, or when the Customer amends, cancels or otherwise changes in any arrangement after commencement of the tour
- 4.2 All refund will be made within fourteen (14) working days in a form of cheque. For credit card payment, refund will be made through the credit card company.
- 4.3 Air tickets with refund value will only be refunded to Customers within fourteen (14) working days after the respective airlines have refunded to the Company. The standard processing period for air tickets refund varies from three (3) to six (6) months (subject to individual airlines).
- 4.4 During peak period, the refund process may be longer due to increase in transactions.

5. AMENDMENT TO BOOKINGS (REQUESTED BY PASSENGERS)

- 5.1 For any changes in departure date or tour type, cancellation fees apply as listed under **Section 2** on Cancellation by the Customer.

7. EXTENSION OF STAY / DEVIATION

- 7.1 Extension of stay may be permitted at the end of tour, subject to the restriction of the air ticket, seat

availability and hotel confirmation prior to the commencement of the tour. **All requests must be made before issuance of air tickets.** If the extension of stay / deviation is unable to be confirmed three (3) weeks prior to the group's departure date, the passenger is deemed to stick to the original tour schedule. - 7.2 Cancellation fee is also applicable if the Customer cancels the booking due to extension / deviation is unable to confirm prior to departure.

Any alteration in routing or dates by the Customer is solely at his/her own risk. The Company and its associated agents will not be held responsible for any inconvenience caused and extra expenses incurred. No refunds will be made for any unused air ticket, accommodation, meals, or sightseeing in part or full.

8. TRAVEL DOCUMENTS, TRAVEL INSURANCE & TRAVEL VOUCHERS

- 8.1 **Passport and other Travel Documents**
It is Customer's sole responsibility to ensure that he / she has a valid passport with minimum six (6) months validity from the date of scheduled return to Singapore, as well as the necessary visas, vaccinations, health certificates and all necessary travel documents as required by various government authorities of the destinations of travel.
- 8.2 **Visa**
The Customer may seek advice from the Company on visa application; however, it is Customer's own responsibility to obtain a valid visa.
- 8.2.1 If for any reason, application for visa or exit permit is rejected, full refund less \$250.00 administrative fee (excluding visa application fees paid to the respective embassies) will be made if the result of the rejection is submitted to the Company at least forty five (45) days prior to departure. If less than forty five (45) days notice is given, relevant cancellation fee as stated under section Cancellation by the Customer will be applied.
- 8.2.2 It is customer responsibility to check that multi-entry Visas have the correct entry dates and destinations before travelling. Please be aware that some itineraries you may travel through a country without making an overnight stop but still require a VISA to enter/exit
- 8.2.3 In consideration for the interests of other passengers in the same group, the Company strongly discourages ALL passengers from applying Visa Upon Arrival at destiny country. The Company takes no responsibility being unable to wait for the passengers who apply Visa Upon Arrival at the Custom.
- 8.2.4 The Company will not be responsible for any expenses, reimbursement or refund of the tour fare if the Customer is deported or refused entry by immigration authorities on the tour for whatever reasons, including improper travel documents, quarantine, custom regulations, possession of unlawful items or irregularities that may cause harm or damage to person or property.
- 8.2.5 For non-Singapore passport holders, please request the Company to check on Visa requirements. The Company renders assistance in Visa application wherever possible. The Company cannot, however, guarantee the approval of such Visa application. This service is subject to (auxiliary) fees. Please check with the Company on the amount.
- 8.3 **Travel Insurance**
- 8.3.1 Arrangement of travel insurance coverage is strongly recommended with respect to unforeseen circumstances such as flight

- cancellation, trip cancellation, loss of deposit, baggage, personal accident, injury, illness, etc. Under no circumstances shall the Company be construed as a carrier under a contract for safe carriage of the Customer or his / her baggage and other personal belongings.
- 8.3.2 The Company shall not be responsible for any loss or damage in relation to flight cancellation, trip cancellation, loss of personal baggage, accidents, injuries and illness.
- 8.3.3 Should there be any amendment to the date and duration of travel, it is Customer's responsibility to inform the travel insurance company to amend the date and duration of the insurance coverage.
- 8.3.4 The Company will be pleased to assist in the enquiries of any travel insurance and related matters.
- 8.4 **Travel Vouchers**

- 9.1 **Accommodation**
Accommodation is as specified in the tour brochure / itinerary / tour booking form. In the event the specified accommodation is not available, every effort will be made to scout for an alternative in another accommodation of similar standard. Hotel room sizes, facilities and services may vary in different country. Accommodation for adults is based on twin-share, double or triple-share bedroom. Different room type might not be on the same level. Single room occupancy is at additional cost.
- 9.1.1 Room size is generally slightly smaller than you may be used to. Space is precious commodity in Europe and especially in its busiest cities. Many of the buildings will have been in existence for hundreds of years and were not built with the modern traveller in mind. The upside is that usually they are in excellent locations and have a fascinating story to tell.
- 9.1.2 Bed sizes may also differ. In Europe King and Queen – sized beds are very rare. Here double beds are the norm and you may often find that a double room consists of two single beds pushed together instead of a full bed but made up with one set of linen. You may also find that twin beds will be placed very close together.
- 9.1.3 A triple room is the same size as twin bedded room. The third bed is always a roll-away bed or sofa bed added into the room. As a result, you may feel the room is very cramped and small.

- 10.5 **Mode of Payment**
Payment may be made in cash, by NETS, PAYNOW, AXS, cheques or credit cards. Cheques will only be accepted if presented to the Company at least seven (7) working days before scheduled tour departure. Credit card payment may incur additional surcharge for special promotion packages, you may refer to our staff for confirmation. Overseas Bank transfer may incur additional surcharge and to be borne by the Customer.
- 11. RESPONSIBILITY**
- 11.1 The Company acts as agent for the carriers, transportation companies, hotels and other principals of the tour packages. The Company accepts no responsibility for any injuries, losses, damages, accidents, flight cancellation, delays, theft, quarantine, customs regulations, strikes, weather hazards, political unrest, changes in itineraries, deportation or refusal of entry by Immigration Authorities resulting from improper travel documents, possession of unlawful items or irregularities that may be caused to person or property. Any losses and/or expenses incurred are the responsibility of the passenger. All proper travel documentation is the sole responsibility of the Customer.
- 11.2 The failure of the Customer to follow reasonable instructions, including but not limited to check-in and check-out places or times or other cause and the losses and/or expenses resulting therefore shall be borne by the Customer.
