

HOME ▶ TIRANA

Meals on Board

Assemble at the airport for your flight to Tirana, the capital of Albania.

DAY 2

TIRANA ▶ BERAT

Albania Lamb & Yogurt Lunch, Traditional Albanian Dinner

Upon arrival, join a sightseeing tour of the city and visit the biggest attractions, like the **Skanderbeg Square**, **Skanderbeg Statue**, **Et'hem Bey Mosque**, **Clock Tower**.

Continue to Berat, one of the oldest city and the pride of Albania architecture. Drop by the **Berat Castle**, which involves a steep walk up a cobbled path, but those who make it to the top will be rewarded with panoramic views of the surrounding area. Visit **Onufri Museum** and **National Historical Museum**. Walk through the old quarters of the town and have a look at the **King's Mosque**, **Halveti Tekke**, **Gorica bridge** and **Mangalem house**.

DAY 3

BERAT ▶ OHRID

Breakfast, Ohrid Trout Fish Lunch, Dinner

Cross the border into Macedonia as you make your way to the UNESCO-recognized **Lake Ohrid**. Visit **Samuil's Fortress** and walk along its historic 4th century walls. See the

Ancient Theatre of Ohrid, built in the Hellenistic style. Walk up the cliff-top **church of Saint John** at Kaneo for panoramic views of the lake and the surrounding mountains. Make a quick photo stop at the **Church of Saint Sophia** and enter the **National workshop** for a paper-making demonstration. You may wish to join an excursion on scenic cruise on Lake Ohrid.

Make your way to **Skopje** – the capital of **Macedonia**. Stroll through the old Bazaar and over the **Stone Bridge** into the New Town. See the **Grand fountain of Alexander the Great** and visit **Memorial House of Mother Teresa**.

DAY 6

SKOPJE ► RILA ► SOFIA

Breakfast, Lunch, Traditional Bulgarian Dinner

This morning you will travel to the **Rila Mountains** where you will visit the famous **Rila Monastery**. The beautiful orthodox monastery was built in the 14th century and houses valuable paintings, thousands of manuscripts, old printed books and masterworks of wood carvings. Head towards **Sofia** the capital of **Bulgaria**. In the evening enjoy the dinner at **Hadjidraganov's Houses with live folklore music**.

DAY 7

SOFIA ► VELIKO TARNOVO

Breakfast, Chinese Lunch, Baked Lamb, Dinner

Embark on a city tour of the Bulgarian capital city. In the heart of **Sofia**, visit the **St. Alexander Nevsky Cathedral** and The **Boyana Church** which is a medieval Bulgarian Orthodox church situated on the outskirts of Sofia. In 1979, the building was added to the UNESCO World Heritage List. After lunch, drive to **Veliko Tarnovo**. Visit the **Tsarevets Fortress**, once past the main gate, it is fairly easy to navigate the fortress on foot. The statue, **Asen's Monument** which was erected exactly 800 years after the city was appointed capital of the Second Bulgarian Empire, commemorates the Tsars for their contributions to the city.

DAY 8

VELIKO TARNOVO ► SINAIA

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Cross the border into Romania and drive to the heart of the Carpathian Mountain for spectacular mountain scenery and visit the **Peles Castle** built in 1883. Peles Castle is a masterpiece of German Renaissance architecture.

DAY 9

SINAIA ► BRAN ► BRASOV

Breakfast, Ribs Lunch, Dinner

Head towards Bran and visit **Bran Castle**, which dates back to 1377. It is best known as Dracula's Castle from Bram Stoker's famous novel. Continue to the medieval city of Brasov. Your sightseeing tour in Brasov includes the **Council Square, Saint Nicholas Church, Brasov Fortress, Franciscan Monastery and Black Church** whose name is attributed to a fire set in 1689 by disgruntled invaders unable to breach the city's walls.

DAY 10

BRASOV ► SIGHISOARA ► SIBIU ► BUCHAREST

Breakfast/Lunch/Traditional Pork Knuckle Dinner With Beer

Join a sightseeing tour of **Sighisoara**, one of the best-preserved medieval towns in Europe. See the **Clock Tower, Church on the Hill, Scholar's Wooden Staircase, Venetian House and Hermann Oberth Square**. Travel to Sibiu, biggest medieval city in Romania. Walking tour to visit **Evangelical Church, Council Tower, Liar's**

Bridge and Brukenthal Palace. Return to Bucharest for the night.

DAY 11

BUCHAREST HOME

Breakfast, Chinese Lunch, Meals on Board

Today you will join a panoramic tour of Bucharest, which includes sights of the **University Square, Romana Square, Victory Square, Arch of Triumph, House of the Free Press and Romanian Athenaeum**. Transfer to the airport in the evening for your flight back home.

Romania, a Country Steeped in History

Embark on an enchanting journey to Romania - the land of the ever popular medieval cities, castles and scenic mountain landscapes.



BRAN CASTLE

Be captivated by the country's natural beauty and rich cultural heritage. From its gorgeous architecture to its priceless artefacts, it's no wonder why travelling to Romania has made the bucket-list of many.

Peles Castle

Nestled at the foot of the Bucegi Mountains in the picturesque town of Sinaia, Peles Castle is a masterpiece of German neo-Renaissance architecture. It is considered to be one of the most stunning castles in Europe by many. It was also the first castle in Europe to have central heating and electricity. Peles was once a summer retreat for the first kings in Romania. The castle was the final resting place for several Romanian monarchs including King Carol I in 1914. Today, it serves as an important national monument in Century Europe. The castle, built from wood, stone, bricks and marble, has 170 rooms for guests to explore. There are detailed carvings and colored murals of historic characters covering the exterior walls and the 66m central clock tower. It also shelters various valuable collections of paintings, sculptures and many other works of art. Each interior is furnished to reflect the German Renaissance architecture, but one can discover elements belonging to the Italian Renaissance, Gothic, German Baroque and French Rococo as well.

Black Church

Located at the heart of Brasov City, the Black Church is the largest gothic church in Romania. Being over 500 years old and considered one of the greatest place of worship. It houses one of the greatest organs in Europe. The Black Church was originally known as the Saint Mary's Church before it was damaged in a fire in 1689. Blackened from the fire, it was renovated and renamed the Black Church. Even today, remnants of the devastating fire still remains, and explains the striking gothic architectural styles of the structure. Erected on one of the church's exterior pillars, high up on the edge of the roof, lies an odd statue of a boy leaning forward as if he had dropped something on the ground. The mysterious existence of this statue still puzzles many to this day. It is believed that the boy was pushed off the building while checking the walls of the church, and a statue was erected to commemorate him. Another interesting aspect of this church would be the bullet holes that can be seen along the walls. They can be traced back to December 1989, when the Revolution against the communist began in Romania.

Bran Castle

Known as Dracula's Castle, the Bran Castle is a national monument and a prominent landmark in Romania. In addition, the castle has been serving as a military fortress for ages. Located near Brasov in central Romania, it became the home to the notorious, fictional character, Dracula, as depicted by the author, Bram Stoker. He based the fictional character on the historical figure Vlad Tepes or Vlad the Impaler, who was perhaps much more frightening than his fictional counterpart. The prince of Wallachia was responsible for more than 80,000 deaths, some of which included his own people. He was known as Vlad the Impaler for his gruesome and cruel punishments, one of which included impalement. There is also an historical account that describes a garden in which all his impaled victims were erected in, it was also the place where he dined. The towering fortress is a key attraction to millions of tourists every year, most of whom are keen to uncover the truth behind the myth. However, the fortress may not be the sight most expect. Homely rooms take the place of dark and eerie exhibitions, and may extinguish the hopes of experiencing a fraction of its dark and bloody past. The castle also includes a secret passageway and a deep dungeon, which was added in 1625. Do consider joining a tour to gain a more comprehensive coverage of the castle.

Meals on board

Assemble at the airport for your flight to Sarajevo—Bosnia and Herzegovina's capital.

DAY 2

SARAJEVO ▶ MOSTAR

Meals on Board, Lunch-Beef Cevapi, Dinner- Beef Sahan

Upon arrival at Sarajevo, enjoy a walking tour of the city's old town, past the **Emperor's Mosque** largest mosque in the Balkans', the **Eternal Flame** and the **Sarajevo Roses** that are dotted across the city. Visit **Sarajevo Tunnel**, which is also known as the Tunnel of Hope. It was an underground tunnel constructed during the Siege of Sarajevo in the midst of the Bosnian War. Travel to **Mostar**, a picturesque city spanning a deep valley of the **Neretva River**.

DAY 3

MOSTAR ▶ DUBROVNIK

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Follow the tour guide and amble along the magnificent Old Bridge for an extraordinary panorama over the river. Bask in the lively atmosphere of the Old Bazaar. After breakfast, travel to Dubrovnik' The Pearl of the Adriatic. Starting from Pile gate, walk along elegant **Stadrun Street**, soaking up its highlights. Pass **Onofrio Fountain** see the Franciscan monastery with its Romanesque-Gothic architecture. Continue walking down the limestone-clad Stradun, one of the widest and straightest streets in Old Town, until you reach the Renaissance-era **Sponza Palace**, which is

the home of the state archives. Other highlights you'll hit along the way include the city's **Bell tower**, **Orlando's Column**, the **Church of St. Blaise**, dedicated to the patron saint of Dubrovnik. Spend the rest of your day at your leisure exploring the town or you can consider joining and excursion to climb up the city walls.

DAY 4

DUBROVNIK

Breakfast

Enjoy a free day of leisure for some shopping or sightseeing at your pleasure in Dubrovnik. You may wish to embark on an excursion to the Montenegro Blue half day tour. Surrounded by high mountains reflected in the blue waters, a fjord-shaped Bay of Kotor is one of the most spectacular landscapes on the Mediterranean. Drive along the bay past Risan and the picturesque Perast to reach the UNESCO World Heritage Site.

DAY 5

DUBROVNIK ▶ SPLIT ▶ ZADAR

Breakfast, Lunch-Black & White Risotto, Dinner



The moment you take your first step into Rothenburg ob der tauber, you'll feel as though you have transported back in time to a bygone era. Dating back to the 10th century, the town came to life with the construction of Rothenburg Castle, and was named after its ideal position above the

River Tauber. Despite its tumultuous history, the town's lasting romantic image saved it from destruction during World War II, hence its title as the most well preserved town in Germany.

Half-timbered houses, stately churches and buildings and ever-impressive gates, towers and ramparts greet you on a leisurely stroll through the narrow streets of Rothenburg ob der tauber, all witnesses to a mighty imperial past. Go for a walk atop the medieval walls that encircle the entire town, or head up the historical Town Hall for a spectacular view over the region. Get a glimpse of the gothic arches and towering spires of the St. Jakob's Church, home to other treasures of art such as the Altar of the Holy Blood and a wooden carving depicting the famous biblical scene of The Last Supper.

Saving the best for the last, Füssen is the final stop on the 'Romantic Road', a charming Bavarian town that opens the pathway to the surrounding mountains. Füssen is renowned for its proximity to the Neuschwanstein Castle, arguably the most famous of King Ludwig II's fantasy palaces. Fully encapsulating the notion of whimsical romance, Neuschwanstein is rumoured to be the inspiration behind the fairytale castle in 'Sleeping Beauty', and its lavish interior will certainly leave you spellbound.




Mount Zugspitze: A Peak That Speaks for Itself

Experience Germany in a whole new height!

If there's one place in Germany that's renowned for its impressive sights of craggy snow-capped peaks, its Mount Zugspitze. As Germany's highest peak, Zugspitze stands 2,962 m high above sea level and is situated near the ski resort of Garmisch-Partenkirchen – a town best known for hosting the 1936 Winter Olympics. From its summit, you'll be able to see four different mountain peaks from Germany, Austria, Italy and Switzerland. At this elevation, the lush green grassland below contrasts with the mountainous terrain above. Boasting the highest altitude and steepest slopes of the Wetterstein Mountains has its perks. For one, the peak is a popular spot for skiers, snowboarders, mountaineers and rock climbers alike. Apart from the thrill-seekers and the adrenaline junkies, the mountain also attracts hikers from all over. Visitors can experience the fresh mountain air and the stunning vistas of this natural wonder as they make their way up the mountain. Currently there are five hiking paths/mountaineering routes to the top of Mount Zugspitze. Each of these routes vary in difficulty levels, with most

of them taking approximately eight to ten hours to reach the top. Keep in mind that you will take almost the same amount of time to make your way down the mountain if you're hiking, hence it's imperative that you pack accordingly. If you're feeling famished after a long climb, you can always tuck into some scrumptious Bavarian cuisine at "Gipfelalm" – a restaurant sitting on the mountain - Enjoy the panoramic sights of your surroundings as you dig into a hearty meal. Drop by the observation deck to get a better view of the Alps, before making your descent. If conquering this summit on foot seems like a daunting feat, you can always take a cogwheel train or cable car up to the Zugspitze. With the Eibsee-Seilbahn no longer operational, the Gletscherbahn cable car the only viable option if you're interested in taking a cable car. Alternatively, you can also board a cogwheel train and watch the alpine scenery unfold as the train chugs down the tracks. The trains - Bayerische Zugspitzbahn – operate between the Eibsee train station and the Zugspitzplatt station at half hour intervals.

century. The heart of Elvas, the area where the castle is located, is the oldest part of the city. From there we make our way to the Praça da República square, where the old cathedral is located, and see the Church of Nossa Senhora da Assunção, we will also pass by the Domínicas Church, with its original octagonal floor plan, past the Manueline pillory and the Torre Fernandina. Then, we will proceed to Marvão, a peaceful town on the highest crest of the Serra de São Mamede, where an outstanding view of the surrounding region awaits you. Then, the tour concludes at Castelo Branco, a charming town in which you will spend the night in.

DAY 4

Lisbon

As the capital of Portugal, **Lisbon** offers visually stimulating vistas that will leave you speechless. The coastal city houses a number of famous sites, including the imposing **Castle of São Jorge**, which had been Portugal's seat of power for over 400 years. The castle itself is divided into two different sections: the Moorish Castle and the Royal Palace.

Evora

Not for the faint of heart, the **Chapel of Bones** is nothing short of intriguing. Situated in **Evora**, the chapel is a renowned monument in the city. Although the exterior of the chapel looks like any other conventional chapel in the world, its interior holds a shocking surprise for unsuspecting visitors.

Inside the walls of this 16th century chapel, lies the bones of thousands of people, which were relocated from the 43 cemeteries encompassing the areas in and around Evora. In an attempt to save the souls of the deceased, the monks decided to move the bones and incorporate them into the interior walls of the church into intricate patterns and designs, providing a dark and visceral showcase of the macabre.

Elvas

Elvas is best known for its fortified and outstanding town. Steeped in history, it is one of the country's most beloved attraction. Located in the far east of Portugal, the town of Elvas resembles a star when viewed from above. The Forte de Santa Luzia or the **Santa Luzia Fort**, which is positioned on the south side of the town, was erected in the 17th century.



CHAPEL OF BONES, EVORA

The fort played a crucial role in the early days as an important point of defense; today it is a military museum that houses weaponry. The structure provides scenic vistas of Elvas and has a few tunnels in and around the fort.

Marvao

The stunning walled village of **Marvao** is a sight that truly embodies Spain's quaint beauty. Positioned 900 m on the craggy peaks of the Serra de Marvao, this compact and timeless village takes visitors back in time. Its charming narrow cobbled streets lined with bleach white houses contrasted with brick-red roofs will leave you speechless. From the village, it's only a stone throw's away to the Portugal's best preserved castles. Marvao's positioning was purposeful — as a natural strategic defense.

Guarda

Similar to Marvao, **Guarda** is an impressive village surrounded by snow-capped peaks. The museum houses 4800 items of interest, which were originally from the Guarda municipality. Although the building was built in 1601, the museum replaced the former old Archdiocesan Seminary in 1940. The tour itself takes visitors through a historical journey that begins with prehistoric times and ends with the 21st century.

A Gastronomic Journey Around **SPAIN & PORTUGAL**

From the hearty paella to the humble yet simple scrumptious, the eclectic cuisines of Spain and Portugal epitomize the unpretentious and authentic offerings of both countries.

As the national dish of Valencia, **paella** is internationally renowned for its rich flavours and the use of fresh ingredients. The traditional versions are comprised of chicken and/or rabbit complemented with a mix of fresh greens and other vegetables. However, the most common one is the seafood paella, which includes a myriad of seafood — calamari, mussels, fish, clams, etc

Another notable Spanish cuisine that's extremely popular are **Spanish Tapas**. The appetizer or snack in Spanish cuisine is often varied and diverse, often presenting itself in an amalgamation of contrasting flavours and textures. The Charcuterie platter, for instance is served cold with a number of ingredients including flavourful cheeses, cured meat (various types of pork), Spanish olives. However, there are times when the appetizers are served hot, the most popular being chopitos - battered, fried baby squid). Wash these delectable finger foods down with some refreshing Sangria, an alcoholic beverage consisting of red wine and fresh fruits.

A must-eat when in Portugal is the famous and mouth-watering **piri piri chicken**. The traditional Portuguese preparation of this dish employs the use of braziers — a container that holds hot coals, which gives the cooked chicken a distinctive smoky flavour. To give it a kick of colour and taste, garlic, oregano, chili flakes, and red pepper are added to the dish. Complemented with fried potatoes, fresh lettuce, cucumbers, and a tomato salad, this dish is a perfect example of Portuguese's, "less is more" approach to cooking.

Besides upholding a strict criteria for the pigs, such as being only milk-fed and aged no older than three weeks, the pigs are roasted in a special oven and are basted with virgin olive oil until the skin turns golden and crispy.

1. RESERVATION, DEPOSIT & FULL PAYMENT

- 1.1 If your minimum deposit is less than the required amount, kindly top up the difference within the next two (2) days.

- 1.2 Payment of deposit does not constitute confirmation of the tour. All group tours are subject to a minimum group size (as determined by the Company) in order for the confirmation to be effected and for the departure to be finalised.
- 1.3 Full payment is required no later than twenty one (21) days prior to departure. In case of tours in peak season, full payment must be made one month before departure. If full payment is not received by the stipulated deadline, the Company reserves the right to forfeit the deposit and cancel the reservation. In such an event, the cancellation fee as stated in Section 2 is payable by the Customer.
- 1.4 By making deposit and balance payment, it is deemed that you have read, understood and accepted the Tour Booking Terms and Conditions in the booking form.
- 1.5 The Company reserves the right to request for a top-up on initial deposit for immediate issuance of air tickets, to avoid incurring additional surcharges.
- 1.6 Customers must top-up the deposits for ticket issuance as and when the air-tickets are required to be issued by the airlines at the stipulated deadline without prior notice. Failure to do so, the Company has the right to cancel the tour and the deposit will be forfeited.
- 1.7 Any amendment within **fourteen (14) days** or after tickets issued, amendment fee would be the same as cancellation fee stipulated in the Terms and Conditions.

2. CANCELLATION BY THE CUSTOMER

- 2.1 Cancellation of booking must be made in writing or in person to avoid any misunderstanding.
- 2.2 The following cancellation fees apply once any group tour package booking is made:

No. of days between departure and receipt of cancellation notice	Cancellation fee per person
35 working days or more	Full deposit
15 to 34 working days	50% of tour fare + Taxes
08 to 14 working days	75% of tour fare + Taxes
07 working days and below	Full tour fare + Taxes

- 2.3 The above cancellation fees apply if the air-tickets are not issued. If the air-tickets are issued, the value of the air-tickets will be added onto the cancellation fees. Company deserve the right to issue air ticket without prior notice. If the deposit amount is insufficient to cover the cancellation fee, the Customers must pay for the difference.
- 2.4 'Working days' refers to Monday to Friday excluding public holidays.
- 2.5 For Free and Easy packages, administrative fees and / or one (1) night hotel rate will be imposed for those travel documents not issued. Once

issuance of travel documents, changes will not be allowed and has no refund value.

3. CANCELLATION BY THE COMPANY

- 3.1 The Company acts as an agent for service suppliers. After deposit or full payment has been made, all arrangements are still subject to final confirmation by service suppliers. At times due to low subscription for a group tour, the Company may choose to cancel the entire tour fourteen (14) days prior to departure.
- 3.2 The Company shall also not be held liable for any contingent costs incurred by the Customer arising from the cancellation.
- 3.3 The Company may recommend alternative tours either to the same destination or other tours, based on the current tour fare of that cancellation period. All prior special discounts given will be not extended for the alternative tours. Should the Customer decide not to accept the alternatives, a full refund on the amount paid by the Customer will be made accordingly by the Company without further obligation or liabilities on the part of the Company and that the Customers shall be deemed to have agreed to release the Company from all liabilities or damages in connection with the cancellation. There shall be no claim for inconvenience, loss of leave and transportation cost due to the cancellation of tour.

4. REFUND POLICY

- 4.1 No refund will be made with respect to accommodation, meals, sightseeing tours or any other services included in the tour fare but not utilised by the Customer, either in part or full, or when the Customer amends, cancels or otherwise changes in any arrangement after commencement of the tour
- 4.2 All refund will be made within fourteen (14) working days in a form of cheque. For credit card payment, refund will be made through the credit card company.
- 4.3 Air tickets with refund value will only be refunded to Customers within fourteen (14) working days after the respective airlines have refunded to the Company. The standard processing period for air tickets refund varies from three (3) to six (6) months (subject to individual airlines).
- 4.4 During peak period, the refund process may be longer due to increase in transactions.

5. AMENDMENT TO BOOKINGS (REQUESTED BY PASSENGERS)

- 5.1 For any changes in departure date or tour type, cancellation fees apply as listed under **Section 2** on Cancellation by the Customer.
- 5.2 For every request made regardless of whether any previous amendment was confirmed by airlines, hotel or otherwise, there will be a minimum fee of \$250.00 per person per amendment. This does not include any other fees imposed by the airlines, ground operator or hotel.
- 5.3 A postponement of tour by Customers for any reason is considered as cancellation. Under such circumstances, the above Cancellation Policies will apply accordingly.
- 5.4 Any change made by the Customer to the existing booking must be in writing or in person at least fourteen (14) days before the tour, after which strictly NO amendments allowed, or cancellation fee applies.
- 5.5 Any replacement or changes of passengers will be considered as a cancellation and not an amendment. This term is applicable to all cases, including but not restricted to the medical and the pregnancy cases.

6. AMENDMENT TO TOUR ITINERARY BY COMPANY

The Company makes reasonable effort to avoid changes in the itinerary. However, the Company reserves the right to make minor changes at any time due to unforeseen circumstances, especially during peak periods or in the event of other circumstances beyond our control.

7. EXTENSION OF STAY / DEVIATION

- 7.1 Extension of stay may be permitted at the end of tour, subject to the restriction of the air ticket, seat

availability and hotel confirmation prior to the commencement of the tour. **All requests must be made before issuance of air tickets.** If the extension of stay / deviation is unable to be confirmed three (3) weeks prior to the group's departure date, the passenger is deemed to stick to the original tour schedule. In the event that the original schedule has been changed by the Company, any extra cost will be borne by the Customer.

- 7.2 Cancellation fee is also applicable if the Customer cancels the booking due to extension / deviation is unable to confirm prior to departure.
- 7.3 Extension of stay / deviation will be at passenger's own expenses and transfer to the airport will not be provided.
- 7.4 It is the Customer's responsibility to hold firm confirmation of their return flight and to re-confirm their flight 72 hours prior to their return date.
- 7.5 The air ticket issued is a special ticket, restricted to specific airline only. It is non-negotiable, non-endorsable, non-reissuable, non-refundable & non-reroutable. Any alteration in routing or dates by the Customer is solely at his/her own risk. The Company and its associated agents will not be held responsible for any inconvenience caused and extra expenses incurred. No refunds will be made for any unused air ticket, accommodation, meals, or sightseeing in part or full.





8. TRAVEL DOCUMENTS, TRAVEL INSURANCE & TRAVEL VOUCHERS

- 8.1 **Passport and other Travel Documents**
It is Customer's sole responsibility to ensure that he / she has a valid passport with minimum six (6) months validity from the date of scheduled return to Singapore, as well as the necessary visas, vaccinations, health certificates and all necessary travel documents as required by various government authorities of the destinations of travel.
- 8.2 **Visa**
The Customer may seek advice from the Company on visa application; however, it is Customer's own responsibility to obtain a valid visa.
- 8.2.1 If for any reason, application for visa or exit permit is rejected, full refund less \$250.00 administrative fee (excluding visa application fees paid to the respective embassies) will be made if the result of the rejection is submitted to the Company at least forty five (45) days prior to departure. If less than forty five (45) days notice is given, relevant cancellation fee as stated under section Cancellation by the Customer will be applied.
- 8.2.2 It is customer responsibility to check that multi-entry Visas have the correct entry dates and destinations before travelling. Please be aware that some itineraries you may travel through a country without making an overnight stop but still require a VISA to enter/exit
- 8.2.3 In consideration for the interests of other passengers in the same group, the Company strongly discourages ALL passengers from applying Visa Upon Arrival at destiny country. The Company takes no responsibility being unable to wait for the passengers who apply Visa Upon Arrival at the Custom.
- 8.2.4 The Company will not be responsible for any expenses, reimbursement or refund of the tour fare if the Customer is deported or refused entry by immigration authorities on the tour for whatever reasons, including improper travel documents, quarantine, custom regulations, possession of unlawful items or irregularities that may cause harm or damage to person or property.
- 8.2.5 For non-Singapore passport holders, please request the Company to check on Visa requirements. The Company renders assistance in Visa application wherever possible. The Company cannot, however, guarantee the approval of such Visa application. This service is subject to (auxiliary) fees. Please check with the Company on the amount.
- 8.3 **Travel Insurance**
- 8.3.1 Arrangement of travel insurance coverage is strongly recommended with respect to unforeseen circumstances such as flight



- cancellation, trip cancellation, loss of deposit, baggage, personal accident, injury, illness, etc. Under no circumstances shall the Company be construed as a carrier under a contract for safe carriage of the Customer or his / her baggage and other personal belongings.
- 8.3.2 The Company shall not be responsible for any loss or damage in relation to flight cancellation, trip cancellation, loss of personal baggage, accidents, injuries and illness.
- 8.3.3 Should there be any amendment to the date and duration of travel, it is Customer's responsibility to inform the travel insurance company to amend the date and duration of the insurance coverage.
- 8.3.4 The Company will be pleased to assist in the enquiries of any travel insurance and related matters.
- 8.4 **Travel Vouchers**
The Company issues travel vouchers from time to time as part of its promotional activities. The Terms and Conditions for the redemption of travel vouchers are clearly spelt out in the appropriate documents and shall be binding on the Customer.
- 9. GENERAL MATTERS RELATING TO TOURS**
- 9.1 **Accommodation**
Accommodation is as specified in the tour brochure / itinerary / tour booking form. In the event the specified accommodation is not available, every effort will be made to scout for an alternative in another accommodation of similar standard. Hotel room sizes, facilities and services may vary in different country. Accommodation for adults is based on twin-share, double or triple-share bedroom. Different room type might not be on the same level. Single room occupancy is at additional cost.
- 9.1.1 Room size is generally slightly smaller than you may be used to. Space is precious commodity in Europe and especially in its busiest cities. Many of the buildings will have been in existence for hundreds of years and were not built with the modern traveller in mind. The upside is that usually they are in excellent locations and have a fascinating story to tell.
- 9.1.2 Bed sizes may also differ. In Europe King and Queen – sized beds are very rare. Here double beds are the norm and you may often find that a double room consists of two single beds pushed together instead of a full bed but made up with one set of linen. You may also find that twin beds will be placed very close together.
- 9.1.3 A triple room is the same size as twin bedded room. The third bed is always a roll-away bed or sofa bed added into the room. As a result, you may feel the room is very cramped and small.
- 9.1.4 Europeans are very socially and environmentally conscious and especially the air conditioning in Europe. During Autumn and Winter seasons, the central air-condition is off in the hotel rooms. So, do not expect the air-condition is switch on in the room. You may open windows to let cold air in if applicable.
- 9.2 **Special Request**
If there are any requests regarding special meals, dietary requirements, adjoining rooms, flight seating arrangement and so on, please inform the Company upon booking. However, such requests are strictly subject to confirmation and availability by the airlines/hotels. There is No halal meal on tour.
- 9.3 **Baggage**
Normally customer is allowed check-in baggage not exceeding twenty (20) kilograms. Only one piece of hand luggage not exceeding seven (7) kilograms is allowed on board the aircraft. Excess baggage must be paid directly by the Customer. Depending on individual airline company policy.
- 9.4 **Meals**
- 9.4.1 Meals, including meals on board flights, are as indicated in the tour brochure / itinerary / tour booking form. If meals on board are not served due to whatever reasons, there shall be no refund or replacement.
- 9.4.2 You and your travelling companions will generally dine together at a designated time. Table will often vary in size and free seating enables you to dine with family members or new travelling companions each evening. A breakfast buffet is included daily and will reflect the local regions tastes and culture. Very occasionally, an early departure may result in a light breakfast box for you to take away if applicable. Lunches are sometimes included but are usually an opportunity for the guest to enjoy some free time to visit a local café, bar or restaurant and eat where the locals do. Your tour manager will be able to provide you with range of options to suit all tastes and preferences.
- 9.5 **Seat Rotation**
For the convenience of all members of the group, passengers may be requested to rotate their seating arrangements on the coach during the period of the tour. Please cooperate when requested upon to do so by the tour manager / tour leader / guide.
- 9.6 **Motor-coach**
For selected itinerary - Wifi on coach using 3G mobile network, it means that connection is slower than standard broadband and at times may not be available. It is good for checking emails, web browsing and updating social media accounts, but less so for streaming video or large photo uploads.
- 9.7 **Single Supplement**
For occupation of a single room, single supplement amount as indicated in the booking form is required.
- 9.8 **Suggested Excursion**
Optional list may be subject to change, depending on the time you are travelling or local circumstances including weather and days of the week. Further information will be provided by your Tour Manager / Guides during the tour
- 10. PRICING POLICIES**
- 10.1 **Tour Fare Includes**
Return economy class group tour air ticket, local transport, accommodation, admission fees, meals and sightseeing programme as stipulated in the tour brochure / itinerary / tour booking form.
- 10.2 **Tour Fare Excludes**
Airport taxes, airport security taxes, airline insurance surcharges, fuel taxes, visa fees, travel insurance, customs user fees as specified by the airlines and airport authorities; local transfer not stated in the itinerary (e.g. free & easy, deviation), laundry, excess baggage charges, beverages, room services, gratuities to drivers and tour managers / local guides and tips to hotel porters (if any); and personal expenses. Please refer to the Company for visa fees, gratuities to drivers and tour managers / local guides, and tips to hotel porters.
- 10.3 **Cancellation Fee**
For Clause 2 – Cancellation By The Customers - tour fare refers to selling tour fare plus airport taxes, airport security taxes, airline insurance surcharges and fuel taxes.
- 10.4 **Child Fare**
Child fare is applicable to children below twelve (12) years old on the scheduled date of departure & departure date from Singapore. The child fare is based on a twin-sharing accommodation with two adults and no additional bed will be provided. A surcharge will be imposed where an extra bed is required for the child or where the child occupies a room with only one adult.
- 10.5 **Mode of Payment**
Payment may be made in cash, by NETS, PAYNOW, AXS, cheques or credit cards. Cheques will only be accepted if presented to the Company at least seven (7) working days before scheduled tour departure. Credit card payment may incur additional surcharge for special promotion packages, you may refer to our staff for confirmation. Overseas Bank transfer may incur additional surcharge and to be borne by the Customer.
- 11. RESPONSIBILITY**
- 11.1 The Company acts as agent for the carriers, transportation companies, hotels and other principals of the tour packages. The Company accepts no responsibility for any injuries, losses, damages, accidents, flight cancellation, delays, theft, quarantine, customs regulations, strikes, weather hazards, political unrest, changes in itineraries, deportation or refusal of entry by Immigration Authorities resulting from improper travel documents, possession of unlawful items or irregularities that may be caused to person or property. Any losses and/or expenses incurred are the responsibility of the passenger. All proper travel documentation is the sole responsibility of the Customer.
- 11.2 The failure of the Customer to follow reasonable instructions, including but not limited to check-in and check-out places or times or other cause and the losses and/or expenses resulting therefore shall be borne by the Customer.
- 11.3 The Company reserves the right to:
- 11.3.1 Alter tour itineraries, travel arrangements, accommodation due to unforeseen changes.
- 11.3.2 Cancel any reservations prior to departure for reasons, including but not limited to the insufficient number of participants. The Company will recommend alternative tours, preferably to the same destination or to other destination. Should the Customer decided not to accept the alternatives, the deposit or tour fare to be refunded without further obligation on the part of the Company, upon Customer's surrender to the Company of all documents issued by the Company for the purpose of the tour package.
- 11.3.3 Require any individual to withdraw from the tour if it is deemed that his/her behaviour is detrimental to or incompatible with the health, safety, interests, harmony and welfare of the other tour participants and the tour group as a whole. Under such circumstances, the Company shall be under no liability thereafter to any such person.
- 11.3.4 To specify the language in which the tour guide will conduct commentary in.
- 11.4 No tour guides, tour managers, tour leaders or other employees or agents of the Company are authorised to commit the Company to any liability and the Company shall not be bound by any statement or representation unless it is in writing and signed by a Management Executive of the Company.
- 11.5 All verbal agreements must be stated in writing and to be duly signed by the Manager.
- 11.6 The Company reserves the right to take photographs and films of the passenger while on tour with the Company, to be used for brochures advertising or publicity material without obtaining any further consent from the passenger.
- 11.7 All tour fares for the respective tour packages are correct at the time of reservation. The Company reserves the right to revise the tour fares and to determine the date of commencement of such revised tour fares.
- 12. COMPLAINT & CLAIM**
If you have a problem during your holidays please inform EU Holidays Tour Manager or local supplier immediately, who will try to make things right. If the matter was not resolved locally, please write to EU holidays Feedback department in writing within seven (7) days from the date of return. It is important to provide us the information quickly. Please quote you booking reference number and all relevant information. Failure to follow this procedure may delay or deny us the opportunity to investigate and rectify the problem, which may affect the way your complaint is dealt with and your rights under this contract.
- 13. MISCELLANEOUS**
The Company reserves the right to change, amend, insert or delete any Tour Booking Terms and Conditions containing in this document, as the case may be, without prior notice. The Tour Booking Terms and Conditions complement those Terms and Conditions contained in the relevant documents provided by third (3rd) party service providers such as airlines or cruise tickets, hotel check-ins etc.
