### DAY 1 **SINGAPORE > SÃO PAULO**

Assemble at Singapore Changi Airport and depart for Brazil's largest city, São Paulo.

### DAY 2 **SÃO PAULO**

**Dinner**  
Upon arrival, whet your appetite with a hearty dinner, before heading to the hotel to rest for the following day's activities.

### DAY 3 **SÃO PAULO > BUENOS AIRES**

**Breakfast, Dinner**  
Get the adventure going with an outing to the Municipal Theatre and Praca Da Se Cathedral, showing off intricate architectural details of the finest. Other attractions to admire include the Pacaembu Soccer Stadium and Bandeirantes Monument. A short hop by car goes through Liberdade, a district with the most massive Japanese community outside of Japan. Then, take a trip by air to Buenos Aires, the capital of Argentina

### DAY 4 **BUENOS AIRES**

**Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner**  
First on the programme is a neighbourhood trail, including Recoleta, Palermo and May Square, named after the May Revolution in 1810 occurring in that area. Load up on eye candy at the Pink House, a stylish presidential estate, the Metropolitan Cathedral and Puerto Madero. Then, get a taste of the local fare at the Traditional Argentinian restaurant. Ease into the evening at San Telmo, then La Boca, a district of abundant early Italian settlers. A tango performance, accompanied with dinner, makes for a perfect ending to the day.

### DAY 5 **BUENOS AIRES > IGUAZU FALLS (ARGENTINA SIDE)**

**Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner**  
Heading to Northern Argentina, the day starts at the Argentina Iguazu National Park. Here, you can hop on board the Ecological Train, chugging from the forest to the riverbank. Catch a glimpse of the ginormous Devil's Throat, a waterfall that plunges over a 72-metre drop.

**DAY 6**  
**IGUAZU FALLS > RIO DE JANEIRO**

*Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

The journey continues at Brazil's Iguazu Falls National Park, where you will descend to the base of the waterfalls. Take a ride up to the highest viewpoint at Salto Floriano. A flight to Rio de Janeiro awaits later in the day.

**DAY 7**  
**RIO DE JANEIRO**

*Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

There's no better way to kickstart the morning than with a cable car ride to the Sugarloaf Mountain with views to die for. A Swiss-made cogwheel train transports you to the top of Corcovado, where the legendary Christ the Redeemer statue (which has become one of the Seven Wonders of the World) resides. For dinner, dig in at the barbecue restaurant and savour the samba show's native dances and percussion music after.

**DAY 8**  
**RIO DE JANEIRO > LIMA**

*Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

Time again to take to the air towards Lima, the City of Kings and a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site. This is where you'll find the regal Government Palace, Cathedral, Archbishop's Palace, Santo Domingo Convent, as well as the perky, yellow-splashed City Hall at the Main Square of Lima. Before we run out of daylight, drop by the urban San Isidro and Miraflores districts and the Parque del Amor, where you can wind down with a view of the Pacific Ocean.

**DAY 9**  
**LIMA > CUSCO > SACRED VALLEY**

*Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

Begin the second leg of the expedition in Cusco, the former capital of the Inca Empire. Scale to the mountain peak to reach Ollantaytambo, an Incan military, religious and agriculture centre. The town's narrow streets and canals has remained unchanged since ancient times. Make a pit stop at Awanakancha, a delightful shop housing unique Peruvian handicraft, as well as the thriving Pisac Market.

**DAY 10**  
**SACRED VALLEY > MACHU PICCHU > CUSCO**

*Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

Ride first class on the Vistadome train, fitted with glass ceilings for sky gazing, which will take you to Aguas Calientes. Here, you'll carry on with a bus ride to the 15th century Machu Picchu archaeological site, which made it to the UNESCO World Heritage list. Get up close to the relics at The Great Temple of the Sun, The House of the Priest, The Sacred Plaza and Inihuatana. Finally, take a Cusco-bound train and return to the hotel for the night.

**DAY 11**  
**CUSCO > PUNO**

*Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

Feast your eyes on some of the most stunning landscapes of Puno, a city in Peru. At 4,300m above the sea level, La Raya is the natural boundary between Cusco and Puno. Make sure to capture the incredibly scenic Andean snow-capped mountains. Next up are the ancient Raqchi ruins, also known as the Temple of the God Wiracocha. The final stop is the Andahuaylillas village, within which lies a gorgeous 17th century church, adorned with angels and cherubs.

**DAY 12**  
**PUNO > LAKE TITICACA > PUNO > LIMA**

*Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

The first stop of the day is at Huayllano, a port of Taquile Island. Engage with the locals and experience the local life by visiting one of the homes. You'll get a chance to try your hand at weaving and crafting local products. Later, take a ferry to the Uros Islands. The islands are formed by layers of totora, a type of plant common in this region, which is used for housing and trade centres for the native folks. After that, head for the Juliaca Airport to travel to Lima.

**DAY 13**  
**LIMA > SÃO PAULO**

*Breakfast, Dinner*

Today, we will be flying straight to São Paulo from Lima.

**DAY 14**  
**SÃO PAULO > SINGAPORE**

*Breakfast*

Spend the day free at leisure to explore São Paulo on your own until it is time to transfer to the airport for your homebound flight.

**DAY 15**  
**CROSS INTERNATIONAL DATE LINE**

*Meals on Board*

Enjoy hot meals on your flight back home as you cross the International Date Line.

**DAY 16**  
**ARRIVAL IN SINGAPORE**
